The week before our spring break Mrs. Jefferies, a governor at our school, Mrs. Parr and I undertook a two-day process interviewing potential teachers for our school. We met some wonderful, inspirational young teachers who specifically chose our school – they knew so much about our school, were extremely passionate about our Christian ethos, the opportunities our curriculum offers and the chance to become part of our school community. We have appointed three teachers, Miss Salisbury who will teach in KS1 and Miss Morley and Miss Jeffrey who will both teach in KS2. I know that you will give them a warm Christian welcome in to our school.

You will have many opportunities to meet our new teachers throughout the Summer term and I know the children will be very excited to meet them.

At the end of this school year Mrs. Gibbon and Norma will be stepping down and handing the reins over to new leaders of Tea and Tots. During the summer term Miss Ward and Miss Ennion will be popping in each Monday morning to ensure a smooth transition. Building work

Over the last three years the Governors and I have been trying to extend and grow our school to enable us to move from five KS2 classes to six – three 3/4 classes and three 5/6 classes. In January I applied for a grant to enable us to build an eco-classroom outside which would release the Community Room back to a classroom. During this process it has been extremely important that we still had space for family learning, tea and tots, before and after school provision and a space in which our school community can meet and spend time together supporting each other. Hence the need for additional space was a priority before we moved the community room back to a classroom.

The news that we had secured the grant has been fabulous and we have started the process of planning and securing quotes for the work. This is such an exciting time for our school and hopefully we will be able to move to six KS2 classes from September 2017.

Please let parents know that we are now taking 45 pupils in places. We hope that our to maintain this structure and thrive, our school succeed and future delivering 'Everyday questions about places for Reception, or the new build endeavor to answer them.




Street Party in Church!
