Dear Parent/Carer,

I am very excited and proud to inform you that we have chosen your child to take part in The Anti-Bullying Ambassador programme.

This is part of the charity, the Diana Award. The Diana Award was founded as a legacy to Diana, Princess of Wales' belief that young people have the power to change the world for the better. The charity works on a number of different projects aimed at reducing bullying in schools. One of the main projects is the Anti-Bullying Ambassadors programme which has trained over 15,000 young people across the UK to lead on anti-bullying campaigns in their schools.

We have chosen your child to become an Anti-Bullying Ambassador as we believe they uphold the qualities required, these being caring, approachable, confident, brave, promoting kindness and are keen to stop bullying. Mr Lambert and I are the adults supporting our Anti-Bullying Ambassadors.

In order to become an Anti-Bullying Ambassador your child will need to attend a regional training event, this will be held in **Blackpool's Winter Gardens** on the **Wednesday 9th November**.

This is a fantastic opportunity and on the day your child will meet and share ideas with passionate staff, professionals and young people of all ages and abilities from schools, academies and organisations from across the North West. Together, we will explore the meaning of bullying, the different types of bullying and the impact of bullying through group work, scenarios, games and art, dance, computing and music workshops.

We will also examine how they can tackle bullying in their schools as Anti-Bullying Ambassadors by making an action plan. By the end of the day, both your child and Mr Lambert and I should feel empowered and confident to take bring back great ideas, get excited and make things happen in our School.

We will be travelling to Blackpool in the Community Minibus and will need to start the day very early and leave school at 7:30am, so we ask if you and your child meet



Mr Lambert and me in front of the school at 7:20am. We do realise this is a big ask, especially if you have work and other children to consider. Any problems please let us know and we can arrange help to get your child to school. Children are welcome to eat their breakfast on the coach if that helps, but this will have to be provided by you.

Children will need to bring any inhalers with them, bring a bottle of water which can be refilled, wear school uniform and bring a coat. There is no cost to you for your child to attend.

We aim to arrive at the Winter Gardens no later than 9:30 and we will be staying there for the whole day, including lunch, which will be provided for your child.

We will then leave at 4:00pm and we will be providing tea for your child, which we will eat on the way home. We have a special surprise tea for your child as they will have worked so hard.

We aim to arrive back to school between 6:00pm and 6:30pm, but we will text you on the way home to keep you informed and give you a more accurate time of arrival.

This is a wonderful opportunity and I am really looking forward to beginning this amazing journey with your child.
