## More Important News

### Feedback from our parent questionnaire

Thank you for returning your questionnaires we were overwhelmed with how many we had returned and how many positive comments we had regarding the safety, opportunities and fun your children have during their time in our school. There were two strands which you feel we could improve upon;

1. Communication.
2. Informing you of your child's progress.

I am asking you for ideas in these areas.

1. We currently pop most events on our website at the beginning of the school year and add events at the beginning of every term which I refer to in my termly newsletter. We use twitter, weekly letters, text messages, websites and also notes on the classroom doors to update you with news and events. At the end of the school year teachers write a detailed report on progress and attainment and throughout the year and if we are worried about your child's progress your child's teacher or I would discuss this with you. ## SAT's preparation – Year 2 and Year 6 parents

### YEAR 2

The tests can be taken any time during May and they are not strictly timed. Most pupils won't know they are taking them as teachers will incorporate them into everyday classroom practice.

#### **Subject**

#### **Test paper**

English reading	2 papers: short text and questions; longer text with separate questions
Mathematics	2 papers: arithmetic; mathematical reasoning
English grammar, punctuation and spelling (optional)	2 papers: spelling; punctuation and grammar (including vocabulary)

Teachers will make sure all pupils in their class are prepared for the tests and there's nothing specifically test-related that you should do to prepare your child. You should just follow the general advice teachers give about supporting your child's learning throughout the year.

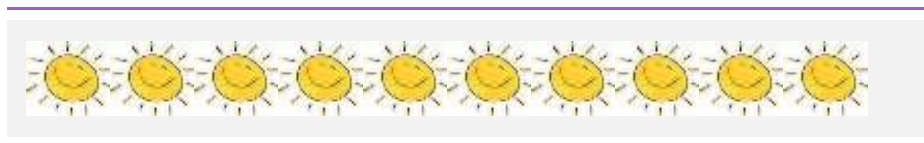
