Notes for parents

All pupils benefit from a good relationship between home and school, and at Witton Church Walk Primary School we are committed to developing such relationships. This agreement formally recognises our responsibilities and is consistent with the school's behaviour and homework policies. Children are invited to sign the agreement when the school and parents agree that they are sufficiently mature and understand all the rules, but all pupils will be made aware of the school's code of behaviour, and we ask that parents support this. All school policies are reviewed from time to time, and the school undertakes to inform parents when changes occur. Suggestions from parents in respect of policies are always welcome, and will be considered by the governors.

The school's curriculum is mainly determined by law, but we have our own agreed aims, which are on the website. These create the ethos in which we want children to grow and flourish, and they represent our values as a school community. We want children to achieve success academically and in every other positive way, and each year we set appropriate end of year targets for each child. These targets are reviewed and changed to challenge the children to ensure that in partnership we support their growth, their development and experiences. The school's overall targets and achievements in national tests are reported to parents and governors, and you will be invited to discuss your child's individual progress and personal achievements each term.

Signing the agreement is voluntary and is welcomed by the staff and governors, but the absence of a signed agreement does not exempt any pupil from complying with school rules. The school will always sign its section of the agreement and abide by it.

1. The Parents

As a parent of a Witton Church Walk pupil I agree to the following:

- a. To make sure my child(ren) arrives at school on time
Doors open at 8.50 a.m. for an 8.55 a.m. start
- b. To make sure my child attends regularly and provides a note of explanation or a telephone call if child (ren) is/are absent.
- c. I understand that holidays in term time will not be authorised.
- d. If my child(ren) is ill I will inform the school on the first day of illness asap and each day until they return to school.
- e. Attend open evenings to discuss child(ren)'s progress and personal achievement.
- f. When possible support my child (ren) in any activity they are taking part in i.e. Class Assembly; Celebration Assembly each Friday, family learning events; displays and presentations.
- g. Give due importance to homework, as defined in the school's homework policy and actively work with your child(ren) whenever possible.
- h. Support the School's policies and guidelines for behaviour and anti-bullying.
- i. Let the school know about any concerns or problems that might affect my child(ren)'s work or behaviour.
- j. To send my child to school clean and smartly dressed in school uniform and ensure they have appropriate PE uniform.
- k. To make sure my child(ren) are picked up promptly at 3.15 p.m or the stated time if attending an after-school club. If I know I am going to be late I know to inform the office.
- l. I have read and am fully committed to and support the Equality Policy
