Time Keeping and Attendance

Since becoming head teacher at our school thirteen years ago our attendance has gone from strength to strength, consistently being over 96% - something we should be extremely proud of as a school community. However, since coming back from COVID our attendance dipped significantly, last year it rose again but we still have a way to go before we get back to 96% as we have always been.

This coming year my attendance officer, family support worker and my SENCo will be putting our rigorous policy in to practice and following our very clear protocol for any attendance that dips below 96% consistently, the child is absent on the same day each week and where medical evidence is not provided. The protocol offers many opportunities for supporting parents and ensuring all our children access the education that they are entitled to, and which is a legal requirement for ALL children. Where the protocols are not adhered to by families, support is not taken up and attendance continues to dip a fixed penalty notice will be issued by myself and the local authority.

Please take some time to read our 'Attendance Policy' which is on the website, this explains our requirements for attendance and explains that holidays will NOT be authorised in term time.

PERSISTANT ABSENCES -

We have had an increase in a number of children who are persistently absent – my attendance team will also be tracking these families very carefully and again offering as much support as we can to ensure their children, again get the support they need in order to access their education. Education is vital for not only academic learning but also to develop our social and emotional skills as well – developing the whole child is key and this is our priority. If you feel you need any support, please just ask Mrs Johnson or Jackie. My door is always open too, we just want to support as best we can to ensure your children are in school each and every day.

LATES -

As well as being in school, being in school on time is essential in order for children to start the day positively in their class with their peers rather than walking in late and not knowing what is being learnt. The number of lates has decreased significantly. Thank you for your support in ensuring all our children start school at the correct time, let's keep this up as we enter this new school year.

REMEMBER - 20 minutes late every day is 1 hour and 40 minutes learning every week that is a Maths and English lesson every week or your child's support with an additional adult.

Let's work together as we have done for the past seven years and ensure we end this year with our attendance significantly above 96% rather than below!

I would like to thank you in advance for your support with this.

Homework Policy

We have made some changes to our Homework policy – please read it carefully, you will find it on the school website.

The most important support you can give your children is the skill of reading and to read accurately and fluently – this opens so many doors in more ways than you will ever imagine. Therefore, we are concentrating on this during our school year. Our Homework Policy has been uploaded onto the school website, or if you prefer you can ask for a paper copy from the office.

Each class teacher will send out a text to each family via school spider each week to explain the homework. There will **not be** any GCP books sent home.

The focus will be reading – fluency, developing vocabulary and comprehension.

Then for maths times tables through Rockstar maths (year 2-6), which will be monitored closely by all staff so please encourage your children to access this and some number work for our youngest children (year 1 and 2), via the numbots app online.

You will still receive the half termly curriculum grid homework but this is not compulsory, we have had some wonderful research completed at home through this and it has fully enhanced the children's learning in the classroom. If you do get some time to maybe complete two or three squares please do – it will only help and support your child with their knowledge and skills.

Payments into school for educational visits, Pantomime and residentials

We would like to reiterate that wherever possible, any payments made to holding. school are made via ParentPay. If need help with your log in details, please contact the school office. Please ensure that all outstanding payment for educational visits and

residentials are cleared before the first Friday of this term – Tuesday 5th September 2023

Due to non-payments, payments for the pantomime and residentials **MUST** be paid for **BEFORE** the day of the visits. If payments are not received your child will be unable to attend. If you have concerns over payments then please contact the office as soon as the letter goes out to speak with Mrs Foulkes or myself and we can agree a way forward...there is always a way forward, please just ask.



New Families

May I take this opportunity to welcome all our new families in to Reception and Nursery. This is an exciting time for any child starting school but I always believe that it is more difficult for the parents. The children generally skip through the doors quite happily whilst we have many parents not wanting to leave the gate!

We have many children starting our school who are already familiar to school as they came to our nursery or they already have siblings in our school, may I ask that whilst we warmly welcome these children we make a special welcome to our new families and try to get them involved as much as we can in our PTA, conversation in the playground and many other school activities we may be holding.

We will continue to request voluntary contributions for educational day visits but if enough payments are not collected then the trip will be unable to go ahead. All visits are subsidised by school but as budgets get cut further this will become less. We are extremely grateful to our PTA for the funds they offer which ensures the majority of our coach expenses are covered for everyone.

The following payments are now online so that you can pay small amounts weekly or monthly as it suits you –

Min Y Don – Year 6 – November 2023, this has been on for a number of months

Pantomime – Reception to Year 6 – December 2023

Mount Cook – Year 4 – March 2024, this has been on for a number of months

Tattenhall – Year 2 – July 2024 – once we have a date confirmed, this will be on ParentPay but will cost no more than £100

The cost of all these upcoming events/residentials are on ParentPay.

Snacks and Lunches

From 1st September a school lunch will cost £2.75 per day. Can you please ensure your child's lunch and snack account are kept in credit as it is unfair on the staff in the kitchen and your child when they are turned away because they already owe money.



Snacks are for children from Year 1 to Year 6, all Key Stage One and Reception pupils get free fruit and milk so please do not feel they need to purchase snack at break time. Water is available freely all day and you are welcome to send in a **HEALTHY** snack with your child for break from home. Please remember juice and flavored water are ONLY allowed with children's lunches.
