### **A quick reminder to parents and carers**

School hours are 8.50am to 3.15pm, Monday to Friday and begin promptly at 8.50am with the register and then an assembly each morning. If you are late for school please remember to sign the late book and order your school lunch. Please keep up our wonderful % for attendance over 95% and also ensuring we are able to keep the number of late arrivals to a minimum.

### **Money**

Lunches are now £2.15 per day.

Paying for lunch, snack and educational visits is via parent pay.

If your child comes to our breakfast club at 8.20am then they need to pay the £1.50 on ParentPay, where your child's attendance is logged daily. Any purchases made will come directly from your child's snack contribution on ParentPay.

Snacks are for children from Year 1 to Year 6, all Key Stage One and Reception pupils get free fruit and milk so please do not feel they need to purchase snack at the hatch. Water is available freely all day and you are welcome to send in a **HEALTHY** snack with your child for break from home.

### **Witton Acorns**

Just a reminder that Witton Acorns, our before and after school care club, is now fully available to all parents to use on a 'when you need it' basis or for more regular bookings. Based out of our Community Room, this club has gone from strength to strength. The club offers a wide range of activities, including indoor and outdoor games, craft, painting, reading, imaginary play, construction, sport, computers, films and much more. Children are encouraged to choose their own activities, based on what they enjoy doing. ## PE Kit must be in school for the first day of term,

Named navy shorts and a white t-shirt with the school logo on, (or a plain white t-shirt), and plain navy jogging top and bottoms for inclement weather. In order to participate in PE your child will need pumps or trainers in their PE bag - school shoes will **NOT** be allowed. Please ensure your child's pumps/trainers fit properly and that they are continually checked. PE kit should be worn for all curriculum and extra curriculum sports activities to meet Health and Safety requirements.

Girls hair **must** be tied back so please ensure a bobble is kept in your child's PE bag. If your child represents the school in a sporting activity they **MUST** have a PE kit in order to go, no PE kit means your child will not be able to represent the school. **Please ensure YOUR child has a school PE kit.**



## SCHOOL UNIFORM

Please note that **ONLY** black school shoes are allowed for school. Pupils may change in to trainers for break time so as not to spoil their school shoes during football! The children are very good at changing to and from school shoes and I commend them for that. If your child does not have their school shoes for whatever reason you must provide a letter to explain why.

## **Pupil Targets**

You will be aware that teachers continuously make assessments of pupils' learning and base their planning for teaching on these 'formative' assessments. Additionally there are the assessments made by 'standardised tasks and tests' at the end of Years 2 to 6 (in KS2 there are also brief tests throughout the year). All pupils have end of year targets, which are closely monitored by our Senior Leadership Team, based on these assessments.

We have moved more towards personalised targets for your child/ren, which will change much more frequently and will be specific to your child's next steps and our detailed marking. These targets can be found in your child's reading journals and in their school books. They will be given to you during parents evening, please ask for them. The targets will show you the journey which your child will be on, what they have learnt, where they need to go and that extra little challenge!

## Safeguarding

## Holidays

One more thing to celebrate is our reduced number of unauthorised holidays being taken during term time. Parents taking children on holiday during term time are aware that fines will be issued. Our policy has been in force now for a year and anyone taking holidays from now which are unauthorised will have a fine submitted to the Education Welfare Officer. Please be reminded that it is BOTH parents that will receive the fine. The policy is on our website, please read it to refresh yourself with the content.

## Head Lice

Please ensure all long hair is tied back and short hair is held off the face with slides or a headband. We do not want our little friends in school if possible! For advice on head lice if your child gets them, please see the letter on the school website. I ask that you do inform us if your child has head lice so we can send a quick note home to allow families to be prepared.

## Absence and Illness

If your child is absent from school, on their return please bring a letter into school to explain their absence. We need to keep a record for when the Educational Welfare Officer checks our registers each term. If your child has been sick could I remind you that they need to **be kept at home for 48 hours** to allow them to fully recover. We have a strict policy on absences and Mrs Koller will be requesting explanation of absences if they are not received.

### **Have I made a healthy choice for my snack today?**

After promoting information about food choices and eating a balanced diet the school council are really pleased with the results of their hard work and dedication. We have more and more children using the knowledge they have gained to help them make a more informed choice about the food they choose for their morning snack. They understand both the benefits to their health and wellbeing and the impact that some foods can have on your body if you eat too much of them. At the end of last term we had a few chocolate bars and packets of crisps sneaking in, please remember we **only allow** healthy snacks at break time.

## **Curriculum Development**

### **PE and AFTER SCHOOL CLUBS**

There will be lots of after school clubs to choose from this year, with some exciting new additions. The children will find out what is on offer next week once we have had confirmation from outside agencies and our local High School, a letter will be coming home on Monday. We hope to see lots of new faces this year. We will have a variety of sports specialists leading our afterschool clubs in partnership with the school sports partnership led by Chris Storey at Hartford High School. This will not only enhance the delivery of our PE curriculum but also further develop key skills which our children will need if they are to become our next Olympic Champions!!!

On Tuesdays we have employed Premier Sports to deliver specialist PE session to our children alongside our teachers, they will also be running two after school clubs and two sporting breakfast clubs from 8am—8.45am. The letter for these clubs will be out shortly. Premier Sports have come with a wonderful reputation and a glowing report from Ofsted, we are very lucky to have them in our school and I know that the staff are very excited to be developing their skills alongside the sports professionals.

### **The New 'Challenging' Curriculum**

It is one of excitement and with many opportunities for the children to experience a vast array of new learning. ### **Homework**

The Government has suggested average homework times as shown below. These daily times assume working on 5 occasion during the weeks. These times **include** the recommended daily reading or book sharing time of 20 minutes.

Reception	20 minutes
Years 1-2	30 minutes
Years 3-4	40 minutes
Years 5-6	50 minutes



Remember to do a little each night, no more than the above guidelines. If you have completed this time and your homework is not finished, hand it in as it is with a short note. Children work at different speeds.

Our Virtual Learning Environment is a password protected website which links home and school in an exciting way. Each teacher has their own space and you will be able to access difference aspects of learning that your child has been completing throughout their time in school.
