



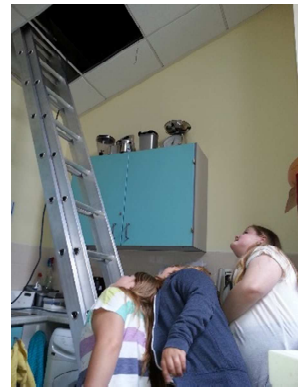
SUMMER TERM NEWSLETTER - JUNE 2015
