

PE and Sport Premium April 2015-----

At Witton Church Walk Primary School we are utilising this years' Primary PE & Sport funding to sustain current developments in improving the quality and breadth of our PE & Sport provision through continually developing teaching and learning in PE, encouraging our pupils to adopt healthy active lifestyles and to take part in a wide range of sports and physical activities including more competitive school sport. The total allocation was £9000.

Impact here can be measured via attendance registers and participant surveys.
